Igor Sikorsky's history has been recorded via various forms of graphics from the Russian years through the American years. The paintings of Sikorsky's first large aircraft S-21 called the Grand are examples of the early graphics. The first S-21 aircraft had two engines. The second version of the Grand was the first four engine aircraft in the world. These aircraft were the largest aircraft in the world at the time.










